Christmas on the Prairie began in 1990 when a group of local citizens decided to establish a community festival. The goal was to promote the Saunders County Museum and the town of Wahoo. Over the past 29 years, hundreds of volunteers have worked to plan the yearly event and have contributed thousands of hours of their time and talent into creating a free, fun family event.

The Saunders County Historical Society was established in 1963. Its goal is to preserve the history of the county for future generations. The Museum complex contains a Main Building, the 1873 Kavan Log House, District 42 Schoolhouse, 1889 Weston Presbyterian Church, Machine Building, Memphis Post Office, the 1886 Wahoo Burlington Depot and a 1920s Caboose. Coming soon is a Wahoo Built Building. Located at 12th and Linden in Wahoo is the Howard Hanson House, birthplace of the Pulitzer
